

## ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL AGES:

*Tutorial Assistance* for Elementary, Middle, and High School Students, as well as the returning College student.

*Wilson Reading Tutorial*: Certified Wilson Reading Teacher provides the structure of the Wilson Method for reading success.

*W.I.N.<sup>TM</sup> Write Incredibly Now*, trademarked handwriting program taught by licensed occupational therapist from Children's Special Services, LLC.

*P.O.P.<sup>TM</sup>*, focuses on interactive experiences to enhance self esteem and confidence.

*Speech Language Services*, articulation, phonology, oral motor, oral and written language, mild voice fluency.

*Jewelry Fabrication*. Class for adults; includes basic techniques of silver jewelry such as forging, soldering, chain and clasp making.

*MS and HS Enrichment*, homework, organization, study strategies/enrichment.

*MS Summer Success Camp*. Offers students an opportunity to sharpen their academic skills before school starts. Students will be working on Mathscapes—a hands-on math program, reading and listening comprehension, keyboarding, team building, and social skills. *SAT Test Taking Strategies*. This course provides an opportunity for students to develop strategies for better success in taking this high-stakes test. Skills development that provide for increased fluency and comprehension is also emphasized. The adult program improves reading efficiency.
